Highlight on Future Resettlement

In Uganda, it is estimated that about 60% of children placed in childcare institutions have living relatives. Over 100,000 children are currently living in orphanages in Uganda. We are striving to work towards lowering these numbers by connecting children with families, either biological, foster, or adoptive families.

We are so excited to share the story of Don and Carol. In the past year, we were able to trace Don's father. We affectionately call him Ttaata Don, which means

Father of Don. Don's mother was only 19 when she died in childbirth. I recently spoke to Ttaata Don and he told me that he was very young at the time and did not know what to do with a new baby. He had no money and no way of caring for Don. He could not afford to buy formula and take care of Don's most basic needs. He decided to have Don be cared for by a family member so that he could finish high school. The family member then told a government official about Don and we came to know about his situation. However, when we visited Don for the first time we were told that he was an orphan with no living relatives and had been abandoned by the mother.

Unfortunately, this happens often as people are desperate to care for their children and there are no records of births and deaths. They believe it is better to lie so the child will be placed in an orphanage and will be given food and a better chance of survival. This story of desperation is common in Uganda where poverty is extreme.

Two years ago, we started to trace Don's family and along the way we were able to get the accurate story and meet Don's father for the first time. In this same process, we found out that Carol is a cousin to Don. Don and Carol have always had a special bond. They even call each other brother and sister. They are the best of friends. We always knew there was something special between them so we were not surprised when we learned that they were related by blood.

Since finding out this new information, Don and Carol have been able to go for family visits during their school holidays. Our social workers have done a Family Assessment and Home Study. Don's father has expressed his thankfulness to the ministry for caring for Don. Ttaata Don and his new wife both desire to care for Don and Carol. They want to be a part of our new resettlement program. Please pray for this new process and for Don and Carol's family.
