Rafiki Update on 5 children!!!



41 children were rescued from a cult but now most have been returned to their families. Please pray for them as in some cases a family member is involved in the cult. The police made Rafiki return all of the 5 children they were caring for to their families, but with the assurance that we can check up on them. The children and the parents were happy to be reunited. Many of the siblings had been separated. We are especially concerned about one of the girls whose father we believe is one of the cult leaders, but whose mother lives separately in a village. One mother asked Sara and Joseph to help her get out of the cult. We are helping to resettle her daughter with her birth father, who is not a member of the cult, and then to help the mother escape the cult. The cult operates under the guise of Christianity so please pray that God will intervene and lead the members to the Truth.

These children will still be apart of our program and therefore we will need monthly financial sponsors to help us with their support. We are hoping to be able to provide school fees for the children and to help their families with income generating projects. Prayerfully consider sponsoring one of these children, as they will need a lot of follow-up care.

Please pray for our social worker, Florence, as she will be doing follow-up visits with each family.

Improvements to Rafiki Children's Village



The land we have been blessed with came with a small two-room house where the caretaker lives. The house was not finished when we purchased the land but we have been able to make some improvements. By those that are privileged, this may not seem like much, but we have finished the flooring and added windows to increase light and air flow. The pit latrine toilet has been finished. Please understand that we do not have running water or power yet. There are some old pigpens on the land, which in the future we are hoping to renovate into chicken coops. Fencing will be finished this week!!! Praise God for the gift of finances to complete the fence. The front gate will be put in soon, hopefully this coming week.

Our next project is getting a rain tank like the one in the picture below for the caretaker's home. Currently, we have to pay someone to fetch water for us and bring it in jerry cans to the land from the community well. We pay 500 UGX (about 20 cents) per jerry can of water. With a rain tank we would be able to use rainwater (which is free) and be able to store water on the land for building. A rain tank will cost around \$300 USD. Prayerfully consider donating to this project.

Pray for Edwin as he continues to feel weak and tired. He gets frustrated because he cannot play like the other big boys because he gets tired quickly.

- Praise God for the children under our care who carry their Christian faith to their families and serve as a witness to them during family visits and when they are resettled. Pray that God gives them boldness in sharing their faith.

 destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy."
