The Baby Tendo Fund was started by Amanda Weber, in honor of Baby Tendo's death and to raise money for a children's home to be built in her name. "In September of 2013, Amanda Weber travelled to Uganda to volunteer at the Rafiki Children's Home for three months. Rafiki is in the process of purchasing land to be able to expand and provide a home for more orphaned, abandoned, and vulnerable children. Amanda's hope in creating this campaign to raise money is that we will eventually be able to fund a building on the land that Rafiki will be purchasing, naming it after Tendo Victoria, as a memorial of her life and a reminder of what God did in rescuing her and in rescuing all of us.



#### **TENDO'S STORY:**

On Sunday afternoon, we were notified that a newborn baby had been dropped into a pit latrine (a hole in the ground used as a toilet), and left

to die amongst human waste and maggots. She was discovered and the police called us to see if we could care for her. We were given guardianship of her and took her to the hospital. We named her Tendo (which means praise in Luganda) Victoria (because of the victory that she was still alive, despite all odds). She went to Heaven the next day.

"What the world threw away, God rescued and cherished and took to be with Him. Instead of letting her die in that latrine, all alone without anyone even noticing, He chose for her to be surrounded by people who were showing love to her, giving her a name, and recognizing her life. Even in her one day here on earth, God used her to show his incredible, redeeming love. I will never forget Tendo, or this experience, and I plan to share her story for the rest of my life." – Amanda Weber, Short-Term Missionary, Kampala, Uganda 10/13/13
