## A Family for every child

We are proud to share that in February we reintegrated seven children with their family. It has been a busy month for us! Jerom and Joel, who are brothers, have been reunited with their biological parents. Don and Carol, who are cousins, were reunited with Don's Dad and stepmother. Oscar was reunited with his mother and step-Dad. Mary was reunited with her biological parents and siblings. Joshua was reunited with his mother and grandmother. We will be including more information about their stories and families in the coming newsletters.

## How does reintegration affect your child sponsorship??

Reintegration will not affect your sponsorship, as we will still need sponsors for every child that has been resettled with their family. Because these families are very poor we will be helping the families with school fees, school uniforms, school supplies, and other necessities for the child. We desire to help the children all the way through university. We will be periodically making phone calls and visiting the children on a monthly basis to check in to see how they are adjusting to their new homes.

Through a partnership with CRANE (Children at Risk Action Network) in Uganda, we have been able to give start-up, resettlement kits to each child. The kits include a mattress, sheets, towel, blanket, sandals, toiletry items, and some foodstuffs. This has been a HUGE blessing for the families that we work with!

#### Meet Acram and Shakirah!!!



Acram and Shakirah are the newest children in the Children's Home. We were contacted by a local government official who told us about a blind grandmother who was struggling to care for her two grandchildren. Because of being blind, the grandmother could not see that the children had Jiggers. Jiggers, also known as the Chigoe flea, is a common parasite in the villages of Uganda. The flea burrows into exposed skin (usually on the feet) and remain there and begin to lay eggs. The skin swells dramatically and causes intense irritation. If the flea is left within the skin, dangerous complications can occur, including secondary infections, loss of nails, and toe deformation. Thankfully their Jiggers were caught at an early stage.

We decided it would be best to care for Acram and Shakirah at the Children's Home while so we can treat the Jiggers and we are hoping to work with their extended family and quickly resettle the children back into a safe and loving home.

Please pray for Acram and Shakirah as they adjust to living at the children's home. They are both old enough to go to school so we will need to support them with school fees. Prayerfully consider sponsoring Acram or Shakirah. Most schools in Uganda cost around 400,000 UGX (\$150 USD) per term with their being 3 terms in the school year.



# Pray for God to provide... Rafiki now cares for 22 children.

As we resettle children with their families, we will be receiving new children to care for in the Children's Home. In the past month, we have resettled 7 children and have 4 new children who have come to live at the children's home. We are almost back to full capacity in the home. We are hoping to reunite more children with their families in the future so that we can care for even more children. In the long run, this will allow us to help MORE children and families. However, helping more children takes more finances. We are praying that God will send the much needed sponsors or donations to cover the cost of providing for children's needs. We do not ever want to have to say, "No" to taking on a child's case. And right now, we HAVE to say NO.

Please help us so that we do not have to ever say NO again. Prayerfully consider sponsoring one of the new children that we are caring for. Another way to help is to donate monthly or even a donation toward school fees or toward ministry costs. We are very frugal with what God gives us through our Rafiki sponsors but it costs a lot to feed so many children, keep them clothed, pay for school, medical care, and staff to minister to their needs. As we continue to grow and care for more children, we will also need to hire a Child/Family Counselor and another Social Worker to help with the child caseload. The desire of our heart is to lead families to Christ through the children we support, to mentor and teach them God's ways. Please pray for the ministry as God continues to grow and expand our vision.
