Our First Harvest on the Rafiki Land!! Praise God!

While we are waiting until we build we decided to plant a crop of corn to sell to help with our finances and also to invest in our community. It has been rewarding to harvest the land after our first season. However, we know that it will be even more rewarding to harvest the gospel within the community. In preparation for this, we have begun to build relationships with our neighbors. We are looking forward to doing more outreach ministries within the predominantly Muslim community. We pray that we can be a light in this dark place; that we can reach people for Jesus. We desire to reach hundreds and thousands for Christ!

Many of our neighbors live in extreme poverty and have no hope. We desire to lift their burden by being a blessing to them on a daily basis. We were able to provide work for those who helped with the harvest. We want to live alongside them, serve alongside them, and suffer with them through their daily struggles. We want to provide them hope through a relationship with Jesus Christ, their Savior!

To be able to accomplish more as a ministry, we feel God calling us to move the ministry home to the land. We know that this will happen in God's perfect timing. Even though we do not yet have the finances, we are moving forward with making plans for building on the land. Our first building project will be a main Children's Home to house the children that are currently in our care. This will enable us to move from the current home that we rent in Kampala to the land in Kakiri (an hour from where we are located currently). Through God's grace, Rafiki Africa Ministries will one day be able to house

hurting and abused children with a safe home that provides nutritional food, quality education, Christian teachings, and a sense of family. The first phase of building will cost roughly \$50,000. Future phases will include the building of a church, school for the community, staff housing, and medical clinic. With this new project, we need YOUR help! Emma was recently resettled with his aunt and cousins. He started a new school nearby his home.

Joshua is now attending the same school as Emma, but in the boarding section. Joshua was one of the first children that came to live at the children's home. We do our best to help each one of our Rafiki kids in the way that God leads us. Last year we

resettled Joshua with his family. We discovered that Joshua had begun to be around bad influences in his neighborhood. Most of the children do not get to attend school and get into trouble because they have nothing to do with their time. It is especially easy for young boys to get caught up in this lifestyle. Girls are kept busy at home helping with cleaning, cooking, and laundry but boys try to find jobs outisde their home to support their families. They are taken advantage of and frequently turn to lying and stealing to get what they want. We desire to prevent Joshua from being in this environment.

Through prayer and discussions with his mother and grandmother, we decided that boarding school would be the best option for Joshua. It is considered a privelage for children in Uganda to attend Boarding School. Joshua is now able to attend school with kids his own age and will receive the support and structure that he needs to thrive. He will enjoy holidays and month long school breaks either with his family or at the Rafiki Children's Home. Your support enables the children, like Joshua, in our program to attend school. Otherwise, the children would be forced into child labour. Thank you for your partnership!
