She was in the cutest hot pink floral dress and little brown winter boots. She had wild hair with little braids that covered her head. I was so taken with Matrona's free spirit and infectious laugh. We went into the police station to sign paperwork...well Uncle Joseph did.;) I used my few Luganda words to draw Matrona in and make her laugh. She giggled and giggled on my lap. My heart completely melted for this little girl. It is an unbelievable blessing to care for a child of God. After the police station, we headed home and she proceeded to jump right in with the kids. Matrona is a ray of sunshine, but she is definitely battling the present absence of her mother. That first night she cried in my arms until she fell asleep.

Whether that is sharing it with others or donating finances to provide assistance. Some people may grow weary of seeing the images we share or listening to the stories we tell, and that is okay. We will continue to

share them because someone has to give a voice to those that have none. Otherwise, no one hears about the

mother who did not receive help in time to save her child. The one who had to watch daily as the son she adored starved to death before her eyes as she listened to his cries, unable to provide any sort of relief. This is what happened to one of the children in our care. We can share his story in the hope that another child can be saved.

DONATIONS NEEDED:

As the Rafiki kids grow, they get bigger, which means they need bigger clothes. Each time we resettle children we provide clothing for them. Do you have kids or grandkids? A simple way to help is as they outgrow their clothes, please donate them. Call Frank Hamilton (512-771-0681) or Jo Hamilton (512-750-8047) to arrange to drop off items at 803 West Noton Street, Pflugerville, Texas 78660. It's about a block from First Baptist Church Pflugerville. Kayla Longino, from Pflugerville, is coming to Uganda in September and Frank and Jo Hamilton are coming in October. They will pack items into luggage and travel with them to Uganda.

- New or used clothes for kids in all sizes from sizes infant 3 months to children's 16/18: pajamas, underwear, church clothes, play clothes, socks, and shoes. The weather here is 60-85 degrees year-round.
- School supplies such as crayons, markers, scrapbook paper, etc.
- Twin size sheets and bath towels
- Children's Bibles
- Lifeway and Mardel Gift cards to purchase biblical and educational materials



Opportunity to purchase another 1/2 acre of land

We have the opportunity to purchase another ½ acre of land that is directly across from the current 6 acres. We are praying about this opportunity and what God wants us to do. Please pray with us as we consider purchasing this land. It will cost roughly \$3,000 USD to purchase this land and have the land title transferred.
