Growing Our First Crop of Maize on The Land

One of our ministry goals is to be more sustainable in our projects. We purchased 6 acres of land last year and are in the process of raising funds to build in the future. While we are waiting to build, we decided it would be beneficial to utilize the land that we have. In November, all 6 acres was planted with corn. Planting is always done at the beginning of the rainy season so that the crops can grow. As you can see in the picture, the corn is growing well. It will be

harvested next month. After the harvest, the corn will be sold. Pray that the harvest will go well and that we will be able to get a good selling price. If this harvest season is successful, we will plant again in May at the beginning of the next rainy season.

Urgent Needs – Washing Machine and Microwave

You can make life easier for those doing the laundry for the children. Our staff have many different roles to fill, so efficiency is key. We had two washing machines but one has been out of service for over 6 months. We have tried to get it fixed but it is not fixable. The second washing machine was recently repaired. For several months, we have been hand washing clothes and bedding. As you can imagine, this is a daunting task. A second washing machine would be so helpful to our staff. With so many little ones the laundry piles up quickly.

Our microwave has been on its last leg for awhile now and finally stopped working. We have spoken to an electrician to fix it but he says that it will cost more to repair it than it would cost to buy a new one.

Why we need a NEW Washer:

When you have 25-35 people using ONE washer for clothes, bedding, school uniforms (and everything else) it becomes a complicated game to get it all clean!



Daily Running of the Children's Home – Mama Monica, Childcare Worker and Cook

We are thankful for our amazing staff at the Children's Home. Mama Monica has been working with us for the past 4 years as a live-in cook and house mother. As one of the older staff members and with grown children of her own, she is very motherly with the children. She is wonderful with the children, especially the little ones. They love to follow her into the kitchen and hang out there while she cooks. She lives at the Children's Home and except for her time off, she is on call 24/7. She is dedicated and hardworking and is the Mama to us all – both kids and adults.
