#### **Child Abandonment**

This picture of an abandoned baby has been trending on Facebook and other social media. →

I know that the heartbreaking picture of this baby is difficult to see. But I want to give you the realistic picture of what happens on a daily basis in Uganda. Babies are abandoned like rubbish in plastic bags. Three years ago, we cared for a baby after she was fished out of a pit latrine, but her lungs were so full of maggots that she suffocated to death. At least, her last few hours she was loved and held in comforting arms. Sometimes I wonder if we had just gotten to her sooner....would she have survived? I know the Lord has plans for every child and am happy that Baby Tendo is with her Father in Heaven.



It has been a season of abandonment in Uganda. The need is overwhelming and discouraging. We receive so many calls from the police and social workers who need a safe place to take these abandoned babies. God has been teaching me a lot through this season, that He has given us different gifts and passions for a reason. I cannot save every child...only God can. God can use me for His glory to help "serve the least of these".

## With your help there can be a happy ending...

I want to share another story about an abandoned baby so that you can see the difference between a sad ending and a happy ending in a child's life. In the June newsletter, I introduced to you baby Florence. We received her into the home when she was only 2 days old after she had been abandoned on the side of the road under a bush. She is the sweetest little baby. We have all become so attached to her in the past 3 months. She is surviving and thriving because of supporters like you.

Our social worker has been working hard the last 3 months to try to trace any of Florence's family. So far no one has come forward with any information. We will be advertising in the next couple of weeks in the local newspaper and on the radio to see if anyone knows anything. We are praying that we will find a family member who can care for her. If no one comes forward then we would like to place her with a foster care family before the end of the year so she can be adopted. Please pray with us!

#### Ways YOU can pray for us this month -

- > Pray for our short-term missionaries Kayla Longino and Alyssa Smith. Pray for opportunities for them to share their faith and to be a help to those that need them.
- Pray for our health. Some very bad viruses have been circulating and many of our Rafiki family have been ill.
- Pray for the Kiwanuka family as they are expecting a daughter, to be delivered by C-Section on September 19. Pray especially for Sara. She has been sick for 6 weeks with a virus and hopes to be well before the baby comes.

- Pray for the people of Uganda. Pray for those who are so destitute that they must abandon their families in hopes that their children will be "taken in" and survive. Pray for the Ugandan government as they seek ways to protect children and help the abandoned and orphaned children of Uganda. Pray for Children's Homes, like Rafiki, who are struggling to have the finances and means to support as many children as possible.
- Pray that God will provide the funding needed to move to our new land. Currently, we need \$100,000 to complete the first part of our building phase so that we can move the Children's Home permanently to our land in Kakiri. This will enable us to serve more children and families in the community.
