# Pray for God's wisdom!

I would like to start this newsletter off with a BIG prayer request. We are in need of YOUR prayers and support in the upcoming days and weeks. Our Local Police Officer, who works in the Child Protection Department, contacted Joseph and I this past week. She informed us of TWO babies that are in need of a loving home. One of the babies was just born this past week. The baby's mother is mentally ill and it is believed that the child is a result of a rape incident. The other baby is a few weeks old and is being forcibly taken away from the parents as they have been abusing and neglecting the baby.

We are praying for God's wisdom and peace in the next few days as we make a decision about caring for these babies. We have never received a baby before....youngest received was 2 years old. We also do not have the finances to cover the expenses of having TWO new babies. We would need to hire another Child Care Worker to help with the daily needs. We know that God is Great and is sufficient in His provision! Please pray!

We do not know the complete stories of either of these children and will be meeting with the Police this week. We will need to make a decision quickly – so please pray for God's guidance and wisdom. Pray that God will speak to us clearly and in a BIG way so that we know without a doubt that this is God's plan.

When we pulled up to Rafiki the first day, love was evident on the kid's faces as they greeted us at the van. Becoming Auntie Emily right away made me feel a part of the family. The vision of Rafiki is such a picture of the Lord not leaving us as orphans in the world. Spending daily time with the 12 beautiful children at Rafiki is sometimes tiring and frustrating.
