# Brenda and Esther's story

As I reflect on Christmas and the end of the year, God has been reminding me of all our beautiful children and their individual stories. Brenda, 7 years, and Esther, 4 years, are sisters that were abandoned by their mother shortly after Esther was born. Their father became ill with AIDS and passed away this year resulting in Brenda and Esther becoming orphans.

Brenda and Esther used to walk miles each day down a dirt path to collect stagnant water in containers and bring it back to their dirt floor hut, boil the water on an open flame to use for drinking or cooking. The day we arrived to bring them home they were out getting water and we took the above pictures. Brenda was 5 years old and Esther was 3 years old. Brenda was very protective of Esther and already acting like a mother.....at only 5 years old. Sitting in the back seat of the car during the drive to the orphanage, although scared herself, Brenda reassured Esther that they were going to live at a good place where they would have plenty to eat. I am very thankful that we were able to help these beautiful girls. Although Brenda is still watches out for her little sister, they are now able to be kids again and feel the security of a loving home environment.





Thanks to your support Brenda and Esther are living at the Rafiki Home. They have a loving family that supports and encourages them. They are able to eat 3 meals a day and go to school. They have Mamas, Daddies, Uncles, and Aunties that cherish them and teach them that they are special. And most importantly they spend time each night worshipping the Lord and learning more about Him. They are adjusting to the loss of their father, who loved them dearly, but they laugh a lot and enjoy playing with the other children. Brenda is blossoming in school.



#### Focus on a Child – Don, 4 years old

Don's mother died while giving birth to him. His father has lost both of his arms and is disabled so he could no longer care for Don. He was living in poverty and hunger in another orphanage that could no longer provide for his everyday needs. He spent many days without eating.

Don came to the Rafiki Home with completely rotted and decaying teeth at only 2 ½ years old. After seeing a dentist in Uganda it was determined that to prevent a horrible infection he would need to have 16 of his 20 teeth removed. By the Lord's faithfulness and provision, we did not have to wait for the infection to get worse before removing his teeth. This little boy is so tough that the only pain medication he had after the procedure was 2 doses of ibuprofen. He has never once complained. He has dentures to use when he eats.

Don is currently receiving an education at the orphanage with our full-time Ugandan pre-school teacher. Starting in January he will be attending nursery (preschool) classes at the school that our older children attend.

His favorite toy is a car. He loves zooming and vrooming around the house with the other boys. He loves playing with the other children. Don is such a cuddle bug. He loves to be snuggled up on the couch with one of his aunties. He has mastered the sad face; big brown eyes welled up with tears, quivering bottom lip, and all. The worst part is...it works! He loves to give hugs and kisses. He's an easy-going kid that can keep himself entertained for hours with whatever he has on hand.

Pray that Don's heart will become increasingly receptive to the gospel as he grows older. Pray



that his memory verses and bible stories will take root in his heart and one-day bear the beautiful fruit of a relationship with Jesus Christ. Pray that Don will feel loved by the staff and other children at the home but ultimately that he will feel loved by Jesus Christ.

- SERVE on the mission field and come to Uganda. We are in desperate need of teachers, childcare workers, nurses, etc. We can use anyone. "We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully." (Romans 12:6-8)
- CONNECT the ministry with local churches, rotary clubs, schools, businesses, etc. Connect us with your friends and family. - SPEAK UP and tell their story. What a simple way of obeying God's instruction to us about the poor...simply tell their story. Proverbs 31:8-9 says "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy."
