

Esther's Apartment Burglarized

March 3, 2014. When coming to the Children's Home this morning, we learned from our Manager, Esther, that her apartment had been broken into the night before. Many items including refrigerator, stove, television, and living room furniture were stolen. Esther lives with her sister only down the street from the Children's Home. We have heard that other homes in our area have been broken into as well.

We praise God for protecting Esther and her sister as they were both at home asleep when the burglars came around 3:00 a.m. The thieves had to break a metal door with a padlock to get in, but Esther and her sister stayed asleep. Praise God for His protection and for keeping them asleep so that no physical harm came to them.

During our devotional time, Esther expressed her fear of sleeping at home. Please pray that "the peace that surpasses all understanding" (Philippians 4:7) will come upon Esther and her sister.

As a ministry, we would like to help Esther during this time. We would like to give her a gift of \$500 to help with replacing the furniture and appliances that were taken. We desire to encourage her during this difficult time. If you are interested in making a donation towards this gift, then please let us know.

Land & Building Campaign

We have been spending the last couple of months visiting pieces of land and doing a LOT of research. We want to be ready for this next step for the ministry. We have been researching building techniques, farming and agriculture, raising animals, solar power, and water access. We have learned a lot in the last few months.

"Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Will he not first sit down and estimate the cost to see if he has enough money to complete it? For if he lays the foundation and is not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule him, saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." Luke 14:28-30

We found out that land is **VERY** expensive in Uganda! An acre of land costs roughly **\$50,000 USD** in Kampala. The farther you get out of the city the cheaper the land becomes but this also means limited access to water, electricity, schools, and health care. Just to give you an example, we found some land outside of the city that currently is selling at 10,000,000 UGX an acre (roughly \$4,000 USD per acre). We are hoping to purchase at least 10 acres to begin with. If you do the math, that equals \$40,000 USD.

Please pray for God's guidance and wisdom as we continue to research buying land and building. We firmly feel that this is God's long-term plan for the ministry. Pray that we are obedient to the community and land that God calls us to.

Restoring Hope – Orphan Prevention and Resettlement

In the upcoming month we will be researching more about resettlement and orphan prevention. We will be meeting with other ministries and organizations that are currently focusing in this area. We will be meeting with Social Workers, government officials, and the local police. Pray that God will open doors for the right meetings to take place. Pray that we will be able to find Christian partners and ministries that we can work together to impact Ugandan families.



Back To School

In this picture, the kids are carrying local brooms that are used for cleaning inside and outside the classrooms. Local brooms are included in their school supply list. I remember shopping for school supplies with my Mom before school started each year and being so excited to get a new package of crayons or markers. Starting a new school year in Uganda is very different. Most children wait knowing that they most likely will not be able to go to school this year as their parent's do not have the money to pay their school fees. Some have to sacrifice so that an older sibling can go to school while they stay at home and work.

School is NOT free in Uganda. Parents have to pay school fees for their children to attend. At Rafiki, we pay roughly \$150 per term (3 terms each year) for EACH child in the home to be able to get an education. This amount does not include school supplies and uniforms.
