Since I've been in Uganda I have seen so many abandoned children. The reasons vary among each child, but the product seems to be the

same. Every time I go into a different orphanage my heart breaks at the number of kids that have been left without a family. At Passion last weekend, Louie Giglio talked about how so many Christians have so much knowledge about God, but they don't really know Him. I have gotten a clear picture of this since I've been in Uganda. The past few years I have learned and researched and talked about this huge problem we have in our world.

- There are over 130 million children who have lost one or both parents worldwide.
- There are over 500,000 children in the US Foster Care system.
- If only 7% of the 2 billion Christians in the world felt the call to adopt there would be no more orphans.

These facts and so many more are consistently in the back of my mind ready to share with anyone willing to listen. I love to talk about the need for orphan care and adoption. However, until you walk into an orphanage and play with a child, feed them, listen to their cries, the facts are just facts. It's only head knowledge. But when you put a face with the facts and a name with the story, it becomes ten times more real. That's how it is with God. It's not enough to just know the information. It is a relationship. It is a daily decision to walk with Him and learn about His character.






Schedule for Upcoming Craft Shows

Focus on a Child – Mary, 8 years old

Mary has cerebral palsy and epilepsy. In Uganda there is a stigma attached to children with disabilities. Many even think they are cursed or possessed by demons. Mary was abandoned by her father and mother. She was alone, hungry, filthy, and living almost 24 hours a day lying on the floor in the corner of a dark shack.

Because of her cerebral palsy, Mary has the mental capacity of a very young child. She cannot talk although she likes making noises and loves to laugh. She can walk around, go up and down stairs, and we have to catch her before she climbs on the table. She is a very active little girl. She doesn't have the fine motor skills to feed herself. But she has learned how to use a sippy cup and is gradually learning how to grab objects. She is developing improved muscle strength and coordination with patience and practice.

Mary is an easy-going, happy girl who enjoys just simple touch from others. She loves cupcakes, having her back rubbed, being held, and is very ticklish. Baths and cold drinking water are a couple of her least favorite things.

Mary attends a special needs boarding school called Elizabeth House. She is receiving the therapy and care that she needs. Praise the Lord for the wonderful ways He has provided for Mary. Pray that Mary will know that she is loved by God and by her Rafiki family.

Ways YOU can support the ministry -

- **PRAY** for the ministry and orphans in Uganda. "Brothers and sisters, pray for us." (1 Thessalonians 5:25)

- SERVE on the mission field and come to Uganda. We are in desperate need of teachers, childcare workers, nurses, etc. We can use anyone. "We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully." (Romans 12:6-8)
- CONNECT the ministry with local churches, rotary clubs, schools, businesses, etc. Connect us with your friends and family. - SPEAK UP and tell their story. What a simple way of obeying God's instruction to us about the poor...simply tell their story. Proverbs 31:8-9 says "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy."
