# We are Overcomers! Introducing our newest little girl – Aisha


Shortly after receiving Janat into the Children's Home, another little one also came to join the Rafiki family. Aisha was found alongside a road near a gas station, being strangled by her mentally ill mother. A man passing by saw what was happening and immediately went to get the police. When they arrived, the mother was very hostile and violent and it was obvious that she was not capable of caring for her daughter. The police contacted Rafiki Children's Home and the mother eventually admitted to a psychiatric hospital. Aisha is about 2 - 3 years old and was dangerously malnourished. Her hair has an orange tint from severe malnourishment. She also has some scars on her body, evidence of past abuse or neglect.





If you look carefully at these pictures of Aisha you can see that she shows signs of malnourishment called Kwashiorkor ("Kwash"). Children that suffer from this form of malnourishment do not look bony, in fact, just the opposite: they look fat and swollen. The swollenness is not normal in children and it is a result of fluid shifts. Dry brittle orange hair is also a common symptom of this type of malnourishment.

She was greeted at the Children's Home by some very excited new brothers and sisters. Aisha was a rather quiet and shy little toddler, but she immediately joined in the dancing with a lot of joy during devotions here at Rafiki! In the past few days, she has blossomed into a very social and fun loving girl. We are so thankful for this little bundle of joy!





Aisha is already doing so much better, but please continue to pray for Aisha's physical and emotional healing! She has been traumatized. Pray for our staff as they make her feel at home.
